MORNING PRAYER

The Angelus is not rung. All stand with the Officiant in silent prayer. No opening sentence is given.

The Officiant says the first half of the Antiphon, and all make the response.

- V. Let us worship the Lord.
- R. Who redeemed us by the Cross.
- The Antiphon is repeated by all at the conclusion, without Gloria Patri.

The following antiphon will be said responsively at the beginning and end of all the psalms assigned for each day, after the final Gloria Patri:

The Lord was led as a lamb to the slaughter, V.

R. And he opened not his mouth.

The Gloria Patri is said at the conclusion of <u>each</u> Psalm.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.
